National Sports Foundation opens for business

The National Sports Foundation (NSF) has opened for business, doubling the reason for the private sector to invest in local community sports projects across England. The NSF will match donations from commercial bodies and contributions from individuals. The Government has invested £34.5m in the Foundation over the next two years to attract this new investment in three key priority areas:

- 2012 Kids - getting more children and young people playing sport
- Women into Sport - involving more women in playing sport
- Fit for Sport - investment in clubs, coaches and volunteers in local communities.

However, this is not an exhaustive list and any project that benefits community sport will be considered for match-funding. For each £1 that you secure from a commercial or private sponsor, the Foundation will match it £ for £ up to the maximum cost of the project (if your application is successful). For example, if you have £55,000 of privately invested funds, NSF will match those funds with another £55,000 giving £110,000 towards the total project costs. The minimum amount of sponsorship that can be matched by the NSF must be over £50,000 and be 'new' money - money the private investor has not put into grassroots sport before. Money will also be set aside so that the NSF can work with the governing bodies of sport to increase the amounts they are able to invest in development at grass roots level. Comprehensive Performance Assessment: Sport in the Culture Block

Sport England has been working with key partners over the last two years to secure the strengthened Culture Block in the Comprehensive Performance Assessment (CPA) for upper tier authorities.
